



D: DOMINANCE

Direct and decisive; they are risk takers and problem solvers. They are more concerned with completing tasks and winning than they are with gaining approval from people. Though the internal drive tends to make them insensitive to those around them, "D"s are not afraid to challenge the status quo, and they thrive when it comes to developing new things. They need discipline to excel, and they respond to direct confrontation. The greatest fear of a "D" is to be taken advantage of, and even despite their possible weaknesses — which include an aversion to routine, a tendency to overstep authority, an argumentative nature, and a habit of taking on too much — they place a high value on time and use their innovative thinking to accomplish difficult tasks and conquer challenges.

D/I Curious concluders who place emphasis on the bottom line and work hard to reach their goals. They are more determined than they are inspirational, yet their high expectations and standards for themselves and those around them typically cause them to make quite an impact, motivating others to follow them. They have an array of interests and can become distracted by taking on too many projects. They often need to focus, prioritize, and simply slow down. Because "D/I"s thrive on activity and forward motion, they like to accomplish tasks through a large number of people. Joshua (JOSHUA1), Noah (GENESIS 6-9), Sarah (GENESIS 16, 1 PETER 3:6)

D/S Achievers with an ability to persevere. They are more active than passive, but they possess a kind of calm sensitivity and steadiness that makes them good leaders. They seem to be people-oriented but can easily be dominant and decisive when it comes to tasks and project planning. They strive to accomplish goals with fierce determination that comes from strong internal drive, but they could benefit from contemplative and conservative thinking as well as spending more time focusing on relationships. Daniel (DANIEL 1-6), Job (JOB 1:5, JAMES 5:11), Martha (LUKE 10:38-42)

D/C Challengers that can either be determined students or defiant critics. Being in charge is important to them, yet they care little about what others think as long as they get the job done. They have a great deal of foresight and examine every avenue to find the best solution. They prefer to work alone. Though they fear failure and the lack of influence, they are motivated by challenges and can often be excellent administrators. They can benefit from learning to relax and paying more attention to people. Malachi (MALACHI 4), Nathan (2 SAMUEL 12:1-13), Nahum (NAHUM 1-3)

I: INFLUENCER

Inspiring and impressive. Enthusiastic, optimistic, impulsive, and emotional – they tend to be creative problem solvers and excellent encouragers. They often have a large number of friends, but they can become more concerned with approval and popularity than with getting results. An "I"s greatest fear is rejection, but they thrive when it comes to motivating others. Their positive sense of humor helps them negotiate conflicts. Though they can be inattentive to details and poor listeners, they can be great peacemakers and effective teammates when they control their feelings and minimize their urge to entertain and be the center of attention. They value lots of human touch and connection.

I/D Persuaders who are outgoing and energetic. They enjoy large groups and use their power of influence to attain respect and convince people to follow their lead. Sometimes they can be viewed as fidgety and nervous, but it comes from their need to be a part of challenges that have variety, freedom, and mobility. "I/D"s could benefit from learning to look before they leap and spending more time being studious and still. They make inspiring leaders and know how to get results from and through people. John the Baptist (LUKE 3), Peter (MATTHEW 16 AND 26, ACTS 3), Rebekah (GENESIS 24) **I/S** Influential counselors who love people, and it's no surprise that people love them. They live to please and serve, and they tend to be good listeners. Looking good and encouraging others is important to them, as is following through and being obedient. They often lack in the area of organization and can be more concerned with the people involved than they are with the task at hand. However, they can be center stage or behind the scenes with equal effectiveness, and they shine when it comes to influencing and helping others. Barnabas (ACTS 4, 9, 11-15), Elisha (1 KINGS 19, 2 KINGS 2-3), Nicodemus (JOHN 3, 7, 19)

I/C Inspiring yet cautious assessors who are excellent communicators through the combination of concerned awareness and appreciation of people. They excel in determining ways to improve production. They tend to be impatient and critical, and they can also be overly persuasive and too consumed by the desire to win. "I/C"s like to work inside the box, and they could benefit from trying new things and caring less about what others think. This personality type often possesses a gift for teaching; they are generally dependable when it comes to paying attention to details and getting the job done. Miriam (EXODUS 15-21), Ezra (EZRA 7-8), Shunammite Woman (2 KINGS 4:8-37)

S: STEADINESS

Steady and more reserved. They do not like change, and they thrive in secure, non-threatening environments. They are often friendly and understanding as well as good listeners and loyal workers who are happy doing the same job consistently. With an incredible ability to forgive, reliable and dependable "S"s tend to make the best friends. Their greatest fear, however, is loss of security, and their possible weaknesses naturally include not only resistance to change, but also difficulty adjusting to it. They can also be too sensitive to criticism and unable to establish priorities. In order to avoid being taken advantage of, "S"s need to be stronger and learn how to say "no." They also like to avoid the limelight, but when given an opportunity to genuinely help others, they will gladly rise to the occasion. They feel most valued when they have truly helped someone.

S/D Quiet leaders who can be counted on to get the job done. They perform better in small groups and do not enjoy speaking in front of crowds. Though they can be soft- and hard-hearted at the same time, they enjoy close relationships with people, being careful not to dominate them. Challenges motivate them, especially ones that allow them to take a systematic approach. "S/D"s tend to be determined, persevering through time and struggles. They benefit from encouragement and positive relationships. Martha (LUKE 10:38-42), Job (JOB 1:5, JAMES 5:11)

S/I Inspirational counselors who exhibit warmth and sensitivity. Tolerant and forgiving, they have many friends because they accept and represent others well. Their social nature and desire to be likable and flexible make them inclined to be overly tolerant and non-confrontational. "S/I"s will benefit from being more task-oriented and paying more attention to detail. Kind and considerate, they include others and inspire people to follow them. Words of affirmation go a long way with this personality type, and with the right motivation, they can be excellent team players. Mary Magdalene (LUKE 7:36-47), Barnabas (ACTS 4, 9, 11-15), Elisha (1 KINGS 19, 2 KINGS 2-13)

S/C Diplomatic and steady, as well as detail-oriented. Stable and contemplative, they like to weigh the evidence and discover the facts to come to a logical conclusion. More deliberate, they prefer to take their time, especially when the decision involves others. Possible weaknesses include being highly sensitive and unable to handle criticism, and they also need to be aware of the way they treat others. Operating best in precise and cause-worthy projects, the "S/C" can be a peacemaker; this makes them a loyal team member and friend. Moses (EXODUS 3, 4, 20, 32), John (JOHN 19:26-27)

C: CONSCIENTIOUSNESS

Compliant and analytical. Careful and logical lines of thinking drive them forward, and accuracy is a top priority. They hold high standards and value systematic approaches to problem solving. Though they thrive when given opportunities to find solutions, they tend to ignore the feelings of others and can often be critical and downright crabby. Verbalizing feelings is difficult

for them, but when they are not bogged down in details and have clear-cut boundaries, they can be big assets to the team by providing calculated "reality checks." The "C"s biggest fear is criticism, and their need for perfection is often a weakness, as is their tendency to give in when in the midst of an argument. However, they are thorough in all activities and can bring a conscientious, even-tempered element to the team that will provide solid grounding. They value being correct.

C/I Attentive to the details. They tend to impress others by doing things right and stabilizing situations. Not considered aggressive or pushy, they enjoy both large and small crowds. Though they work well with people, they are sometimes too sensitive to what others think about them and their work. They could benefit from being more assertive and self-motivated. Often excellent judges of character, they easily trust those who meet their standards. They are moved by genuine and enthusiastic approval as well as concise and logical explanations. Miriam (EXODUS 15-21, NUMBERS 12:1-15), Ezra(EZRA 7, 8)

C/S Systematic and stable. They tend to do one thing at a time—and do it right. Reserved and cautious, they would rather work behind the scenes to stay on track; however, they seldom take risks or try new things and naturally dislike sudden changes in their environments. Precisionists to the letter, they painstakingly require accuracy and fear criticism, which they equate with failure. Diligent workers, their motivation comes from serving others. Esther (ESTHER 4), Zechariah (LUKE 1), Joseph (MATTHEW 1:1-23)

C/D Cautious and determined designers who are consistently task-oriented and very aware of problems. Sometimes viewed as insensitive, they do care about individual people but have a difficult time showing it. They often feel they are the only ones who can do the job the way it needs to be done, but because of their administrative skills, they are able to bring plans for change and improvements to fruition. "C/D"s have a tendency to be serious and could benefit from being more optimistic and enthusiastic. Despite their natural drive to achieve, they should concentrate on developing healthy relationships and simply loving people. Bezalel (EXODUS 35:30-36: 8, 37:1-9), Jochebed (EXODUS 1:22-2:4), Jethro (EXODUS 2,18)







CedarCreek DreamTeam Descriptions

Joining the CedarCreek DreamTeam is just one way you can begin to make a difference. This list of opportunities is not exhaustive, but it does provide a detailed overview of serving opportunities available during the weekend services as well as during the week. As you think about where you might want to serve, be sure to consider what fits with your schedule and life.

All DreamTeam members will have the opportunity to connect with their Ministry Team to discuss role requirements and any questions you may have.

Administration Team - This team is passionate about using their gifts of administration and organization to promote efficiency and excellence at CedarCreek. They serve the church in areas such as logistics, data entry, offering/finance, and more. Administrative opportunities are available in practically all ministry areas and are Campus specific. For more information, please see your Campus staff team. (Weekend and flexible weekday opportunities)

Arts Team - This team exists to create an excellent, distraction-free environment that allows for guests' hearts and minds to be ready to hear God's Word and then respond to it.

Social Media - This team uses creativity on digital platforms and at events to reach thousands by delivering inspiring and engaging content through storytelling, photography, videography, planning, and posting. (Week and weekend opportunities)

Green Room Hospitality Team - This team serves by preparing meals for those on the Arts and Production teams during the weekend services. (Weekend opportunity)

Online Chat Moderator - Chat moderators engage with guests during the CedarCreek weekend service on our web and social media platforms (i.e., CedarCreek.tv, Facebook, YouTube, etc.) to cultivate a welcoming space for people to take their next steps in their life-changing adventure through the weekend experience. (Weekend opportunity, online only)

Music - This team serves the church with their gifts by leading attenders in music and worship. (Auditions are required along with a midweek rehearsal.)

Lead Vocal - A lead vocalist is responsible for performing songs at a high level of excellence, must be able to replicate the character and meaning of songs with precision, and must have a great storytelling stage presence.

Background Vocal Melody - A background vocalist is responsible for memorizing all lyrics and the melody to each song, learning the original vocal phrasing, and being flexible to adjust to live vocalists' phrasing. This role requires continual pursuit of vocal ability growth.

Background Vocal Harmony - Background vocal harmony is responsible for memorizing all lyrics, learning the melody and harmony to each song, learning the original vocal phrasing, and being flexible to adjust to live vocalists' phrasing. This role requires continual pursuit of vocal ability growth.

Drums - A drummer is responsible for locking in with the bassist and click track, paying attention to kick/ snare patterns, "communicating" transitions with appropriate fills, and learning any unique drum patterns in the song. The drummer is also responsible for running tracks and needs to have a basic understanding of Ableton.

Keys – A keys player is responsible in the worship context for keeping things simple and avoiding overplaying, especially with the left hand. Familiarize yourself with the Mainstage application and how to play with sounds other than piano (pad, organ, Rhodes, synth, etc.).

Electric Rhythm Guitar – A rhythm guitarist is responsible for having a good knowledge of chords and rhythms, being able to lock in with the bass and drums (the rhythm section), playing secondary lead parts when necessary, and recreating the feel/character of the original song's rhythm guitar part.

Electric Lead Guitar - A lead guitarist is responsible for having a good knowledge of chord inversions and scales and being able to play the hook or main riff of the songs while not overplaying.

Acoustic Guitar – An acoustic guitarist is responsible for having a good knowledge of chords and rhythms, of how to lock in with the bass and drums (the rhythm section), of acoustic guitar techniques (strumming, finger picking, chord arpeggiating, etc.), and of how to use a capo and play in different chord shapes.

Bass Guitar – A bass guitarist is responsible for locking in with the drummer and click track, paying attention to kick-snare patterns, and learning any unique bass patterns in the song.

Production - This team serves the church and the weekend experience through technology.

Camera Operator – A camera operator is responsible for operating a video camera and maintaining composition and camera angles based on our standards throughout the weekend services.

Sound tech – The sound tech manages all aspects of audio, including the house mix, stereo in ear monitor mixes for the band, and the mixes for the lobbies and video room.

Video Director – The video director oversees the on-screen experience in the auditorium and oversees the camera and computer volunteers.

Computer Operator - The computer operator is responsible for cueing slides, videos, and other visual media.

Backstage Assistant/Stagehand – A backstage assistant helps facilitate stage traffic and onstage transitions, as well as managing stage equipment and props.

Lighting Technician-The lighting tech is responsible for operating the lighting console and controlling and cueing all stage and auditorium lighting.

Producer - The producer ties together music and the production to ensure everyone is working together. The producer is an advocate for the guest and helps to make the experience as excellent as possible while looking at service elements through the lens of a guest perspective.

CedarCreek Kids – This team exists to introduce kids to Jesus and the life-changing adventure with him. We do this best when we create a safe and fun environment where kids and families feel known, cared for, and connected. This team intentionally invests in the lives of children and families by providing a welcoming check-in experience, excellent care of babies and toddlers, authentic small group conversations, engaging large groups with biblical teaching, and more! Babies-4th Grade. (All positions require a background check.)

Babies Group Leader – You create a safe, fun and nurturing environment, helping parents and their baby feel great about spending an hour with us, as you rock, snuggle, read, and play. You have the privilege of laying a foundation of faith and building relationships with children and families. (Weekend opportunity)

Check-In Team Member – Your personal interactions, assisting new and returning families with check-in, set the tone for an excellent weekend experience. (Weekend opportunity)

Environment Team Member - You help ensure the service is run with excellence by maintaining the space, snack, supplies, children's needs, and other ministry details while providing helpful support to all leaders. (Weekend opportunity)

Large Group Team Member (Preschool or Elementary) - You lead the Large Group experience, presenting the lesson and application in a creative and engaging way to capture the attention of children and introduce them to Jesus. (This is a talent-based position. Auditions may be required.) (Weekend opportunity)

Group Leader (Preschool or Elementary) - You create a safe, fun, and nurturing environment to connect relationally with a small group of kids in order to lay a foundation of faith and to help kids take next steps. (Weekend opportunity)

Special Friend - You provide excellent care and assistance to a child with special needs by giving him/ her individual attention throughout the service and providing alternatives to curriculum when necessary. (Weekend opportunity)

Toddler Group Leader - You create a safe, fun and nurturing environment, helping parents and their toddler feel great about spending an hour with us, as you rock, snuggle, read, and play. You have the privilege of laying a foundation of faith and building relationships with children and families. (Weekend opportunity)

Worship Team Member (Preschool or Elementary) - You create a fun, energetic, and engaging environment for children to know and worship Jesus. (This is a talent-based position. Auditions may be required.) (Weekend opportunity)

CedarCreek Students - This team serves 5th - 12th grade students every week by creating an environment where students are introduced to Jesus and the life-changing adventure with him. We do this by providing an irresistible, fun environment; consistent Group experiences that challenge students to take their next steps; leadership development opportunities; and dedicated leaders who invest in the lives of students inside and outside of church.

Groups Coach (Middle School and High School) - The Groups Coach mentors, advises, and assists the Group Leaders to ensure they are equipped to lead well. The Groups Coach also helps recruit new leaders. (Weekend and weekday opportunities)

Group Leader (Middle School and High School) - Each Group Leader is key in shaping the spiritual and social bonds that connect students in smaller Groups. Ideally, two adults lead each Group of students to build trusted relationships and celebrate spiritual growth. These friendships extend beyond Wednesday nights! Through events, outings, and frequent communication, Group Leaders and students form an intimate community where trust is central. The Group experience is the cornerstone of CedarCreek Students. (Weekend and Wednesday night opportunities)

Guest Services Team (Middle School and High School) - You are the face of

the ministry to students and parents. The Guest Services team helps create an irresistible environment for students during weekend services (middle school only), and our Wednesday Night Student Experiences. The Guest Service team consists of multiple teams: Check-in/Host Team, Set-up/Reset Team, Production Team, Food Team, as well as Administrative positions as needed. (Weekend and Wednesday opportunities)

First Impressions Team - This team tangibly demonstrates the love of Jesus and that each guest matters to God and to us by providing a friendly, welcoming, and safe environment from the time they pull into the parking lot until they begin their drive home.

Hospitality Team - This team is passionate about serving in practical ways and uses their gifts to prepare and serve coffee and other beverages, as well as other hospitality weekend experiences for our guests. (Weekend opportunity)

Events Team - This team is passionate about serving in practical ways and helps host special events by serving guests with food and creating an environment of excellence. (Weekend and weekday opportunities) Facilities - This team is passionate about serving in practical ways and works behind the scenes to maintain a spirit of excellence in our facilities for the weekend services, making sure they are clean, presentable, and functioning properly. Serving opportunities also include preparing facilities for baptism, conferences, and special events. (Weekday opportunities)

Greeter/Usher Team - This team loves people and makes them feel welcome at CedarCreek. They open doors with a smile and greet guests as they come in the building. They also provide weekend service notes for each guest, assist with finding a seat if needed, and provide our guests with a positive, distraction-free atmosphere, allowing them to worship and hear the message of Jesus. (Weekend opportunity)

Guest Services - This team uses their gifts in the Guest Services area in the lobby, providing connection first and then information and resources that will help guests take their next steps in their relationships with Christ. (Weekend opportunity)

Lobby Hosts - This team exemplifies CedarCreek's value that every person matters through engaging in conversation with people in the common areas and the auditorium, helping to make CedarCreek a friendly, welcoming place. (Weekend opportunity; Campus specific)

Medical Team - This team consists of licensed healthcare providers (nurses or doctors) who care for guests by offering basic medical attention to our guests in the event of an accident or injury at CedarCreek. (Weekend opportunity)

Outdoor Greeter/Parking Lot - This team is the guest's first impression of CedarCreek. They manage the flow of the parking lot for services and events, making parking easy and efficient. (Weekend opportunity)

Safety Team - This team helps provide a safe environment for the kids, students, and guests. (Weekend and weekday opportunities; requires background check, training, and additional screening)

Sparkle Team - This team is passionate about serving in practical ways and works behind the scenes to maintain a spirit of excellence in our facilities for the weekend services and special events, making sure they are clean and presentable. (Weekend opportunities)

Legacy Team - This team is passionate about using their gift of giving to build God's Kingdom locally, nationally, and internationally through the local church. Legacy Team members see the vision God has and want to continue to see the church share the love of Jesus with as many people as possible. To hear more about how giving is making a difference or about the Legacy Team, see your Campus staff team. (Weekend and weekday opportunity)

NextSteps Team - This team assists our guests in taking their next steps on the spiritual journey, whatever that step may be. From helping with baptism to training up leaders, the NextSteps Team offers a variety of opportunities.

Baptism Team - This team hosts those guests who have chosen to take the next step of baptism. Responsibilities include setting up and tearing down baptism tubs and assisting guests through the process, from offering support and encouragement all the way down to dry towels. (Weekend opportunity)

Group Leader - You have a passion for connecting with others and helping them take their next step in the spiritual journey. You are responsible for hosting a Group, providing a space for people to find freedom in meaningful community through authentic relationships. You form your Group around topics or activities you enjoy. Each week throughout the semester, you offer Encouragement, Scripture, Prayer, and a Next Step (ESPN) for your Group members. (Group Leader Training is required for this role.) (Flexible opportunity) **Group Coordinator** – You have a passion for leadership development and enjoy investing in the lives of others. You are responsible for providing support and encouragement for the Groups Coaches assigned to you. You pray daily for them as you get to know them and invest in developing them spiritually. You also serve as a communication link between the CedarCreek staff and the Groups Coaches. (Flexible opportunity)

Groups Coach – You have a passion for seeing others reach their full potential by intentionally investing in their lives. You are responsible for providing support and encouragement for the Group Leaders assigned to you. You pray daily for them as you get to know them and invest in developing them spiritually. You also serve as a communication link between the Hub Leader and the Group Leaders. (Flexible opportunity)

GrowthTrack Administrator – You have a passion to help guests take their next steps in practical ways. You are responsible for assisting the GrowthTrack Host by greeting and checking in guests as they arrive as well as operating the technology to keep the session running smoothly. (Weekend opportunity)

GrowthTrack Host – You have a passion for helping people take their next step and have a strong grasp of the four steps of the spiritual journey: Know God, Find Freedom, Discover Your Purpose, and Make a Difference. You are responsible for hosting the GrowthTrack weekend experience, facilitating discussion and answering questions guests have about the spiritual journey. (Weekend opportunity)

LivingItOut Team – This team is passionate about using their creative communication skills to help people know God through the weekly LivingItOut Bible Study (LIO). The LIO is a Monday through Friday study that correlates with the weekend message. Opportunities with this team include writing, editing, and proofing the study each week. (Weekday opportunity)

Prayer Team – This team compassionately intercedes through prayer for our guests, ministries, staff, and church leadership. (Weekend and weekday opportunity)
