SAFETY TEAM'S GUIDING SCRIPTURE

1 Peter 5:2 – Be shepherds of God's flock that is under your care, watching over them—not because you must, but because you are willing, as God wants you to be; not pursuing dishonest gain, but eager to serve;

TEAM VISION

- The Lord has called us to serve the members of CedarCreek Church in a broken and fallen world with grace and humility.
- We accept and encourage broken people to come here. We need to be prepared to deal with what can come with them. The Church Safety Team is a ministry called to be servants first, eyes and ears for the police and to protect when called upon.
- There are several levels of safety needed to protect those who come to and work on our Campus. They may be as minimal as asking someone to refrain from coming on Campus to responding to someone meaning to do great harm to those on our Campus.

HOW DO WE DO THIS

- We let the G.U.E.S.T. principles guide every opportunity and interaction:
 - **God's Heart** – *we want every guest to know they matter to God and to us.*
 - **Upbeat** – *we are serious about what we do, but always portray a friendly demeanor.*
 - **Excellence** – *our attention to detail shows that we care about our guest.*
 - **Seize Wow Opportunities** – *we look for opportunities to go above and beyond to keep everyone safe.*
 - **Take a Next Step** – *we encourage and point our guests in the right direction to take a next step.*

SCHEDULE

- Saturday 5:15, 7/Sunday 9, 10:45 and 12:30
- Arrive 45 minutes early and check-in for your serve in your huddle room and get your name badge. This is a great opportunity for you to connect with other Dream Team members.
- Attend the VIP Huddle led by your team leader.
- VIP stands for: Vision – Information – Prayer
- Auditorium doors open at least 15 minutes before the service
- There are also opportunities to serve at events, momentum, fusion, vertical and CR.

OUR TEAM ROLE

- Assist in all emergencies situations
- Medical responders will be assigned to the safety and security team. Medical responders will handle all medical calls as a first priority on the team. Each medic will administer medical aid as a first responder until EMS arrives on scene, then yield control to EMS and support EMS in their needs. All medics on each team will be a ministry partner along with other members of his/her team.
- In the event of a medical emergency, an assigned medical responder attached to a safety and security team will respond to the scene. He or she will take control of the patient to determine the emergency, severity of the call, and control needed resources.

TEAM RESPONSIBILITIES

- Wear a lanyard with your medical badge.
- Sign roster to confirm shift coverage for date/service and check into the computer system.
- Check in with hospitality lead and safety and security team lead for identification and so usher knows your location during service.
- Watch for the “999” code while in the auditorium.
- Have the AED available if needed. (Security team member should bring this to the scene)
- Render first aid to the patient and determine if EMS is needed to be called via 911 for patient.
- Assume control of the scene and use on-scene campus safety members as assets to direct EMS, if needed. The medic will be the controlling authority in determining patient care.
- Determine if patient is ambulatory or must be treated on scene, if safe.
- Stabilize and comfort the patient until EMS arrives.
- Communicate patient information to EMS upon arrival.
- Support EMS on scene.
- Complete an incident report on call and patient.
- On-duty medical responders will be responsible for inventorying each medical kit for needed equipment and will inform the safety and security team lead of additional supplies needed to maintain appropriate levels of equipment.

TEAM RESULTS

- Have personal and spiritual fulfillment through being a part of a team and the giving of one’s gifts and abilities by ministering to guests during a time of their physical need.

HOW TO JOIN THE TEAM

- Complete the Growth Track.
- Meet one-on-one with ministry leader.
- Complete the application.
 - A Church Medical team member has a medical background/experience such as doctor, nurse, paramedic, emergency medical technician, or other medical first responder.
