Position Summary:

- Lighting design, programming, & execution of outside events (Fusion camp, Christmas in July, etc.)

- Repair and maintenance of AVL equipment
- Assisting with new installs and AVL upgrades
- Planning and installation of campus security cameras
- Help with live/recorded events (Weekend services, Student Night, CR, Business Meeting, etc.)
- Managing of arts devices on Mac Server
- Learning all production areas and training up new team members
- Ability to troubleshoot with Dreamteam members when support ticket is opened
- Management of Production network (Dante switches, Pathway/Enodes, VLANS, etc.)
- Creating, editing and keeping CreekHelp training documents up to date
- Willingness to travel to other campuses

Position Requirements:

- Being a tithing, Missional Member in good standing at CedarCreek Church
- Championing the 5 Agreements of CedarCreek Church
- Attendance at a weekend service and in an adult LifeGroup
- Modeling and championing the Mission, Vision and Core Values of CedarCreek Church
- Obeying the CedarCreek Church Staff 10 Points of Accountability
- Any additional requirements set by the Direct Report and/or the Executive Director

Measurements:

The Production Assistant will be evaluated by the following quantifiable measurements:

• Timely execution of weekend responsibilities.

- Willingness to adjust programming to meet expectations of lighting and production director.
- Clear communication of weekly schedule and planned objectives.
- Willingness to complete tasks as directed by directors
- Willingness to stay up to date on current technology and campus standards

Accountabilities:

The Production Assistant will also be held accountable for the following:

- Ensuring that Church, Campus, and Ministry values are upheld personally and among volunteers.
- Maintaining good fiscal responsibility, stewarding resources with excellence.
- Maintaining unity within the Arts Department, across all Campuses and Ministry Areas
- Maintaining a positive mental attitude regarding the Church and its leaders, Ministry Services, and in the presence of guests, staff and volunteers at all times.

ADA List for Physical Activities and Requirements, Visual Acuity, and Working Conditions of the Position:

- Climbing. Ascending or descending ladders, stairs, scaffolding, ramps, poles and the like, using feet and legs and/or hands and arms. Body agility is emphasized. This factor is important if the amount and kind of climbing required exceeds that required for ordinary locomotion.
- Balancing. Maintaining body equilibrium to prevent falling and walking, standing or crouching on narrow, slippery, or erratically moving surfaces. This factor is important if the amount of balancing exceeds that needed for ordinary locomotion and maintenance of body equilibrium.
- Stooping. Bending body downward and forward by bending spine at the waist. This factor is important if it occurs to a considerable degree and requires full motion of the lower extremities and back muscles.
- Kneeling. Bending legs at knee to come to a rest on knee or knees.
- Crouching. Bending the body downward and forward by bending leg and spine.
- Crawling. Moving about on hands and knees or hands and feet.
- Reaching. Extending hand(s) and arm(s) in any direction.
- Standing. Particularly for sustained periods of time.
- Walking. Moving about on foot to accomplish tasks, particularly for long distances or moving from one work site to another.
- Pushing. Using upper extremities to press against something with steady force in order to thrust forward, downward or outward.
- Pulling. Using upper extremities to exert force in order to draw, haul or tug objects in a sustained motion.

- Lifting. Raising objects from a lower to a higher position or moving objects horizontally from position-to-position. This factor is important if it occurs to a considerable degree and requires substantial use of upper extremities and back muscles.
- Fingering. Picking, pinching, typing or otherwise working, primarily with fingers rather than with the whole hand as in handling.
- Grasping. Applying pressure to an object with the fingers and palm.
- Feeling. Perceiving attributes of objects, such as size, shape, temperature or texture by touching with skin, particularly that of fingertips.
- Talking. Expressing or exchanging ideas by means of the spoken word. Those activities in which they must convey detailed or important spoken instructions to other workers accurately, loudly, or quickly.
- **Hearing**. Perceiving the nature of sounds at normal speaking levels with or without correction. Ability to receive detailed information through oral communication, and to make the discriminations in sound.
- Repetitive motion. Substantial movements (motions) of the wrists, hands, and/or fingers.

<u>Physical requirements of this position.</u> Medium work. Exerting up to 50 pounds of force occasionally, and/or up to 30 pounds of force frequently, and/or up to 10 pounds of force constantly to move objects.

The visual acuity requirements including color, depth perception, and field vision.

• The worker is required to have close visual acuity to perform an activity such as: preparing and analyzing data and figures; transcribing; viewing a computer terminal; extensive reading; visual inspection involving small defects, small parts, and/or operation of machines (including inspection); using measurement devices; and/or assembly or fabrication parts at distances close to the eyes.
